

ALICE REITERATES STANCE ON DOOR-LOCKING DEVICES

A recent Associated Press article titled "Ohio Building Board Cautions Schools about Barricade Devices", written by Andrew Welsh-Huggins, incorrectly identifies a door looking device in a photograph as an "ALICE device".
